PROBLEMS THE INDIAN ECONOMY IS FACING

Since 1991, the Indian economy has pursued free market liberalisation, greater openness in trade and increase investment in infrastructure. This helped the Indian economy to achieve a rapid rate of economic growth and economic development. However, the economy still faces various problems and challenges, such as corruption, lack of infrastructure, poverty in rural areas and poor tax collection rates.

1. UNEMPLOYMENT

Despite rapid economic growth, unemployment is still an issue in both rural and urban areas. The fast rate of economic growth has left unskilled workers behind, and they have struggled to find work in growing industries.
2. POOR EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS

Although India has benefited from a high % of English speakers (call centre industries), there is still high levels of illiteracy amongst the population. It is worse in rural areas and amongst women. Over 50% of Indian women are illiterate. This limits economic development and a more skilled workforce.
3. POOR INFRASTRUCTURE

Many Indians lack basic amenities which lack access to running water. Indian public services are creaking under the strain of bureaucracy and inefficiency.

Promotion Policy

- A student will be promoted to grade X , if he/she has passed in all the subjects.
- If he/she fails in any subject, it is mandatory to pass the retest, which will be scheduled after the final PTM and before the new term starts. Hence final promotion will only happen after clearing all the papers, failure to which will lead to detention in grade IX itself.
- It is mandatory to pass in English Language and Literature and in S.U.P.W to be promoted to grade X.
- A student will be eligible to write the final examination if he/she has at least 75% of attendance.

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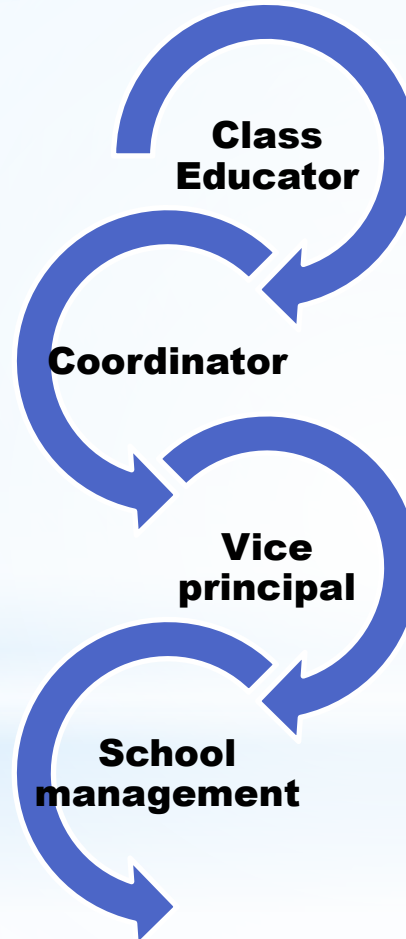
GENERAL GUIDELINES
